

Mount Dewey Trail Map

In 2014 the **Historic Green Mountain Falls Foundation** purchased 139 acres of forest land on Mount Dewey in an effort to preserve the beautiful backdrop from future development. Additionally, the acquisition provides open space for the residents and visitors of Green Mountain Falls with well-built, sustainable trails featuring magnificent views of the Ute Pass valley.

The new Mount Dewey Trail was completed in August of 2015 and was designed and constructed by volunteers from the Green Mountain Falls Trails Committee and the Mile High Youth Corps. The Bratton Trail extension was built in 2017 to thank Dick Bratton of the Green Mountain Falls Trails Committee for his commitment to furthering the beautification and accessibility of Mount Dewey.

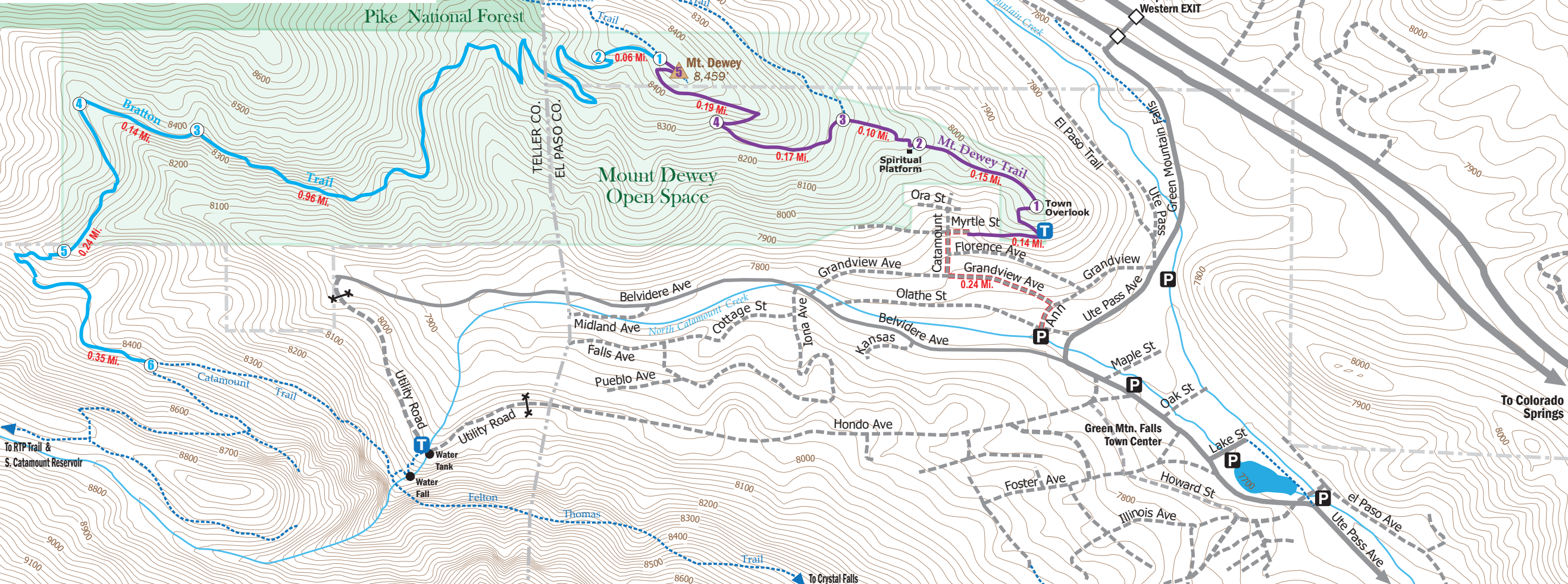

Directions to Mount Dewey
 From U.S. Hwy. 24 (approaching from Colorado Springs), take the second Green Mtn. Falls/Chipita Park exit (a left exit). Follow Green Mtn. Falls Road and continue straight on Ute Pass Avenue. Take a right on Olathe Street and park near the intersection of Ann Street. To reach the trailhead, walk north on Ann Street, take a left on Grand View Avenue and the first right onto Catamount Street. Take the second right onto Myrtle Street and follow the road to the trailhead.

Trail Length: 1.00 miles one-way
Elevation Gain/Loss: + 719' (one-way from parking area on Olathe St.)
Trail Difficulty:

Waypoints:

- @ 0.00 Mi. - Parking on Olathe St.
- @ 0.24 Mi. - Trailhead at the end of Myrtle St.
- @ 0.38 Mi. - Town Overlook.
- @ 0.53 Mi. - Trail to spiritual platform.
- @ 0.63 Mi. - Intersection with connector trail.
- @ 0.80 Mi. - Major switchback.
- @ 1.00 Mi. - Mt. Dewey summit.

Bratton Trail

Trail Length: 1.78 miles one-way
Elevation Gain/Loss: + 547', -558' (one-way from Mt. Dewey summit)
Trail Difficulty:

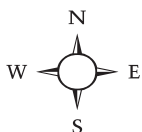
Waypoints:

- @ 0.00 Mi. - Mt. Dewey summit.
- @ 0.02 Mi. - V-intersection, Bratton Trail is to the left.
- @ 0.09 Mi. - First of many switchbacks.
- @ 1.05 Mi. - Major drainage way and switchback.
- @ 1.19 Mi. - Major drainage way and switchback.
- @ 1.43 Mi. - Heavily wooded drainage area.
- @ 1.78 Mi. - Intersection with the Catamount Trail.

Trail Difficulty Ratings:

Trail difficulty levels are subjective. These criteria are based on an average, healthy adult who is moderately fit. The primary criteria used to determine the level of difficulty were based on the following hiking parameters: steepness of terrain, elevation gain, length of trail, altitude and trail surface (packed dirt, loose skree, boulders, etc.). Please hike at your own risk.
